

CAPS Radio KPPQ-LP Ventura 104.1 FM

Membership/Programming Information

CAPS RADIO - KPPQ-LP is a division of the not-for-profit Community Access Partners of San Buenaventura (CAPS Media Center) and is a non-profit, non-commercial low power FM station as sanctioned by the FCC. KPPQ-LP broadcasts 24/7 at 104.1fm and streams on the myTuner app and on capsmedia.org/radio.

Our stations' mission is to create an engaged and informed community through electronic media.

Programming supports and enriches the community via the airwaves with programming focused on **localism**, **service**, **diversity**, **community**, **education** and **entertainment** – these programs include locally created radio shows, rebroadcasts of CAPS video programming, pre-produced programming by members, other LPFM stations and syndicated non-commercial programs.

You can become a member and produce your own show, creating programming for KPPQ 104.1 fm. Each producer shall deliver a weekly program of one hour, with ½ hours shows to be considered. But we also encourage longer or shorter series, documentaries, radio theater performances as well as spiritual programming. Bi-lingual shows are also encouraged.

The station is not broadcasting live, we use an automation program. Member producers reserve time in the studio or in the podcast booth for recording. The studio can accommodate one host and up to 4 guests for discussion. Call-in capabilities are available through your cell phone. Programs can be delivered in person or via the dropbox link located on the web page. Other documents are available online as well.

Only non-commercial programming will be allowed. You will receive the FCC and Legal Guide which details rules and regulations for producing content.

All program producers are required to become a member of KPPQ – CAPS Radio at \$50 per year, this includes training classes and one on one instruction.
